Ages 0-100+. North Aurora, take the summer challenge to read and participate in fun activities! Everyone is invited to join the fun and earn prizes with challenges for every age.


Children and teens can pick up badge books and log reading/activities online at messengerpl.beanstack.org or via the Beanstack Tracker app.


Virtual Transgender 101


