Messenger Public Library is FINE FREE

Tell your students! Tell your friends! Everyone who checks out books or other items at Messenger Public Library will never pay overdue fines! Fees for lost or damaged items still apply. Overdue fines are based on where you check out, so using other libraries may incur fines.

Checkout periods are 28 days for all items. Books, audiobooks, kits, etc. will automatically renew twice if there are no other holds on the item. DVDs may not be renewed.

SWAN Libraries

Messenger is part of the SWAN consortium, which provides access to books and materials from 100 libraries across Chicagoland. If your personal card is not from a SWAN library (eg. Aurora, Naperville), visit the User Services desk to add your card to our computer system. Download the SWAN Libraries app for easy access to your account, library card number, and to place holds.

School Teacher Cards

North Aurora principals may apply for staff to use school cards: fine free with extended checkout. The school is responsible for fees for lost or damaged books. Contact us for details.

Library Cards for Kids and Families

Invite Messenger to your next family event and we will register North Aurora residents for library cards! Parent/guardian must be present with photo ID and proof of residency.

New Illinois legislation ensures all students can get a library card! Most students live within the boundaries of a local library (Messenger, Aurora, etc.). However, a few households do not already pay property taxes to a library and must purchase an annual library card. With the Cards for Kids Act, all students are eligible for a free library card! Call 630-801-4331 for details.
