Your Library is open with reduced services and hours, and with several changes in place in consideration of public safety and the safety of staff. Limited library service will include browsing and material check out, curbside service, and limited computer access. Patrons over the age of two will be required to wear face masks, everyone must maintain proper social distancing, limit time spent in the Library, keep their interaction with library staff

to under 10 minutes, and take advantage of self-service checkout whenever possible. Study Rooms, meeting rooms, plus some spaces, materials and services will remain unavailable. The book drops will remain open, and our digital resources can be accessed 24/7. We are continuing to monitor changes related to the pandemic, evaluate risks, and follow the advice of assisting public health entities. 
Do you like romance, mystery, biography, nonfiction? Large print?
