Food for Fines April 19-25

During National Library Week, April 19-25, the Library will waive \$1.00 in overdue fines for each item of non-perishable food donated, up to a maximum of \$10.00 per library card. Examples of items that can be donated: canned goods, baking mixes, rice, beans, soups, spaghetti sauce and pasta. Out-of-date, damaged or open food items cannot be accepted. Donated food items will be sent to a local food pantry. Fines owed for lost, damaged or missing materials will not be waived.
