Monday, February 22 • 7:00-8:00 p.m.


Dr. Robert Moorehead, professor of sociology at College of DuPage, will present a discussion on important issues that are in the news, as well as a historical perspective on racism.

Candidates must file completed forms and petitions with the Village Clerk at the Village of North Aurora Village Hall during the filing period beginning December 14 at 8:00 a.m. through December 21 at 5:00 p.m. Filing hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday, December 14 through Friday, December 18, and 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Monday, December 21. Eagle Scout Tristan Diekman Builds Little Free Library Box

Eagle Scout candidate and North Aurora resident, Tristan Diekman, has been working this past year to build a Little Free Library Box for North Aurora community residents. The Little Free Library Box contains used books that North Aurora residents can take and read. Tristan and his fellow Scouts from the Boy Scouts of America Troop 11 built the box this past fall as part of Tristan's final service project to earn his Eagle Scout status. Tristan and other scouts collected 6,223 books that will be used to keep the box filled. The project was a cooperative project with the Messenger Public Library and the North Aurora Fire District. The new box is installed near the west side Fire Station #2 along Tanner Road.
