



#### DIRECTOR'S CORNER

The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) has been a topic in national library discussions lately, and I thought I would share a bit of what this federal agency does.

In 2024, IMLS was awarded \$266.7 million, or just .003% of the federal budget, and .75 cents per capita. This tiny portion has a big impact as funds are distributed to state libraries for projects and improvements. How does this affect us? IMLS funding is distributed by the Illinois State Library. Funding totaled \$5.7 million in FY 2024—the sixth-highest amount in the country. This supports the RAILS library system in delivery, databases and ebooks, resources, programming, professional development, and operations for various types of underserved libraries. MPL receives per capita grants each year. hopes for future accessibility grants to improve our entrances and bookdrop, and relies on RAILS for ongoing materials delivery as we share items across our SWAN consortium and the state.

While I can't predict the impact of projected cuts NOR confirm the final outcomes as this is all under discussion, I'll monitor the situation and

update our community accordingly.
MPL is primarily locally supported and
we will continue to provide materials
and resources, cultural programming,
and foster a sense of community as a
cornerstone of education and democracy.
